Fundamentals of Realist Painting

A workshop of essential oil painting skills | 32 Hours

This workshop is designed to suit both absolute beginners as well as intermediate-level artists that want to develop a solid theoretical and practical base for their painting practice or simply explore oil painting as a medium.

In this workshop you will learn:

- Simple drawing strategies that will enable you to accurately draw even the most complex subjects
- A Step-by-step approach for making an oil painting from start to finish
- How to mix and apply oil paint, including how to work with different oil painting surfaces & mediums.
- How to arrange tonal values to create and control the illusion of light and form in your work
- Colour theory that will allow you to mix the right colour every time, and to take your paintings to a new level of realism

Each day in the workshop will consist of 3 parts: a theory lesson to introduce key concepts and techniques, short-form exercises to practice working with these ideas, and work on a multi-day project working from a photo reference to combine what you have learnt into a still life painting.

Both your instructors are academically trained, practicing artists. They are also skilled teachers with several years of experience at the Barcelona Academy of Art, working with beginner, intermediate and advanced drawing and painting students.

Workshops will be presented in English with printed notes available in English and Greek.



Palette Knife x 1

Palette knives come in all shapes and sizes. We recommend getting one with a teardrop or diamond shape. An ideal size is between 3cm - 5cm long with about 1cm of width.

Filbert Brushes x 5

Hog hair filbert brushes are sturdy, flat brushes with a rounded or pointed tip.

Width = 15mm \times 1 Width = 12mm \times 2 Width = 7mm \times 2

Round Brushes x 2

Soft synthetic round brushes are ideal for blending and detail work.

Width = 2mm x 1 Width = 5mm x 1

^{**} Choose Yellow Ochre Light If you have the option

^{***} This is an expensive pigment, but definitely worth buying. Alternatively consider getting another opaque, medium red like Naphtol Red (PR112), W&N Scarlet Lake (PR255) or W&N Windsor Red (PR255+PR254)
